5 Race meets across Term 2
Relay Concludes the competition as a separate event
The school with the most points at the end of the 5 race meets in each of the Boys / Girls age Category wins the Shield.

The runners will still need to be timed and these scores submitted to SAAS with points awarded to the top 15 runners in each category with every runner who does not finish in the placing points scoring 1 point for their school (Encourage Participation).

These points will be tallied, the school with the most points at the conclusion of the 5 race meets is the winner of the SAAS Shield in that age category.

Only a team's top 4 runners can score bonus points with other runner who compete score the 1 participation point.
It adds a tactical element to the race day with runners who finish out of the top 4 placings, but in the top 15 positions able to block opposition runners from points by finishing in front of them and hence denying them that placings points.
This is the scoring system we should have been implemented from the start of the competition but we were not made aware until the competition had started.

- Relay is a stand Alone Event to conclude the Competition-4 Runners Required for each team
- Events will run concurrently for SENIOR (Yrs 10, 11 and 12) MIDDLE (Yrs 7, 8 and 9) Primary (Years 5-6)
- All schools are expected to have their own First Aid Kit
- School Athletic uniforms must be worn
- All schools are to provide at least ONE Official
- Host Schools to provide required equipment
- Host Schools to provide a map of the Course, clearly showing the starting point this map is to be provided with the program.
- Junior and Primary events to be between 2 km and $4 \mathbf{k m}$.
- Senior events to be between 4 km and $6 \mathbf{k m}$
- Schools are encouraged to enter as many runners as they like.
